"My maternal grandfather's family, the Fitzgerald's, first settled on a farm at Lance Creek in the 1890's. My mother was born in Wonthaggi Hospital and members of her family still live in Wonthaggi.

Some Wonthaggites may be familiar with my maternal grandmother's family, the Kurrle's, who also arrived in South Gippsland in the 1890's. Opening a Hotel in the thriving coal mining town of Jumbunna (now a farming community) between Wonthaggi and Korumburra which they owned until it closed in the late 1960's.

I was born and grew up in Korumburra where my mother and brother still live. I believe I'm related to half of South Gippsland through my mother's family and her marriage to Russ West after my father died! I still look forward to visiting the "hills of home" as often as I can".

Inspiration Behind the Lens

Let me introduce **Ian Moorhouse** our photography judge: He has been following the shutterbug since his high school years in the early 70s. He went on to teach photography in various schools and colleges and completed his own Bachelor of Education at Melb Uni, majoring in Photography.

In 2006... he then resigned from teaching to pursue his own freelance interests and commissions for some of the following publications; Custom Car, Australian Muscle Car, Paper Makers Association of Victoria,

Eye to Eye Graphic Design.



My own practice in photography began in 1975

"My initial interest in photography began in 1972 when I was fortunate to have film maker and photographer Paul Cox allow himself to be studied.

My own practice in photography began in 1975 when I met my good friend Paul Coutts at RMIT. He became my photographic tutor and mentor. He instilled in me a great love of straight, (purist), b/w photography by the early American modernist Edward Weston.

Camera equipment was kept to a minimum: Pentax K1000 with a 50mm lense only. Exposure and darkroom printing was based upon the technique of Pre-visualisation.

Since the seventies my photography has expanded to embrace Digital. I have no one specific genre other than I have a great interest in the world around me. I am particularly interested in the human condition and find it easier to explore this as an outsider in foreign environments. Consequently travel is constant source of inspiration. Ian also creates artist portfolios... wouldn't we all love to have one of those done?

At eighty years of age Wonthaggi artist Kathy West held her first solo exhibition at ArtSpace Gallery. At ninety years of age and artist and now author Kathy West launched her first book on Saturday 23 March. 'Reflections' covers almost a century. Kathy collects her memories from beginnings of horse and cart days, of new frontiers in Papua New Guinea, of riots in Malaysia and the rag trade in Australia.

Although initially interesting, her Grandmother's stories of bush rangers and early settling days, became tiresome for Kathy after endless repeats. For a time she closed her ears and mind until, her Grandmother gone, she recognized a deep regret for losing the details and some of the stories entirely.

This inspired and drove a determination to not let her own children or grandchildren make the same mistake to lose heritage and history and hence Kathy's 'Reflections' are immortalised in print. So beautifully told, Kathy spirits us on her journey of joy and sometimes hardship leaving us with intrigue and yearning for more.

It's not just a book for her offspring, but a book for us all to enjoy.

A prolific artist, author and remarkable woman embracing life, Kathy's inspirational phrase is

" It's Never Too Late," to start something , particularly in the arts.
